2. Background

Since the beginning of the public demonstrations in March 2011, around 100.000 Syrians, including women and children, have been killed and more than 2 million have been displaced into the neighbouring countries. These numbers are still expected to rise.

Some people have fled their houses because of the invasion which turned their area into a potential battle field. The risk of losing life is too much if they stay in their residences and therefore they had no option except leaving their living places. For the lucky families who have a relative who lives in another area (at this point of time considered to be less risky) have joined them, the rest have gathered to live with thousands of other displaced families in schools, temporary camps or even in outdoors, or still stay at the risky areas under siege.

The crisis continues to deepen in Syria with a starkly worrying picture for the humanitarian situation. Widespread damage and destruction to medical facilities have left large parts of the population without access to health care and many children are denied education as schools become collective shelters for IDPs or have been badly damaged.

The indiscriminate use of explosive weapons, including cluster munitions, in densely populated

areas which increases incidents of death, destruction and deep trauma among the civilian population. Ordinary men, women and children continue to be caught up in the violence with limited ability to flee to safer areas.




3. Project Description

Through this project Islamic Relief support field hospitals with medical bags needed urgently to treat and save lives of injured people inside Syria. These medical items used in the hottest areas by the Syrians medical staff.

5. Activities Progress

5.1 Preparations

- By May 2013 IR Mission received a grant from IR Australia to implement an emergency project to support the Syrian refugees inside Syria.
- After the success of the first projects in partnership with the foundation for human rights and freedoms and humanitarian relief (IHH) in December –May 2013, IRW implemented the project in partnership with this NGO in Turkey.
- The project preparations and coordination with relevant bodies were done involving the local partner, the governmental firms and IR different departments.

5.2 Implementation

Introduction

Project components targeted the internally displaced Syrians in northern Syria: suburbs of Idlib , Aleppo , Hama suburbs and Lattakia

Through this project IR Mission provided the medical points and hot line with medical bags. IR Mission in coordination with the local committees distributed these items on around 1630 person

Conducting the needs assessment

- Different visits to the field were conducted by IR field monitors.
- IR staff met with local communities in the areas in order to assess the actual needs.
- Final lists, including number, were prepared.

Procurement Process

- IR Partner, IHH, conducted the purchasing process of the items according to the partner transparent procurement process.
- The process involved:
 - Preparing the bids documents and items' specifications.
 - Collecting quotations from well-known companies.
 - Approving from the purchasing committee.
 - Selecting a local company of the best quality and price.

Ordering and receiving the items at the main storage of IHH in Reyhanli, Hatay
 Province of Turkey from where items were dispatched to Syria.

Delivering Process

- All the awarded items were received at the warehouses in Reyhanli, the border town of Hatay-Turkey.
- Registering and entering the items to Syria for distribution.
- Distributing in the identified locations and obtaining the delivery receipts.
- The items were distributed on the targeted medical points
- IR staff distributed the items in cooperation with the cluster committee.

5.3 Monitoring

The whole process of the procurement and logistic medical bags was managed by IHH staff and supervised by IR field team that is based in Reyhanli, Hatay while distribution process was conducted by IR field supervisors involving local committees
