Sindh Flood Relief Operation (August 2003)

The continuous rains from the end of July to the beginning of August 2003 paralysed life in Sindh. The Provincial Government of Sindh declared emergency due to widespread heavy rains and subsequent floods. The rainfall was the heaviest during the last seven years. It intermittently continued for about one week and resulted in the flooding of about 1,900 villages, damaging thousands of houses. Drainage systems collapsed in most urban areas and streets were inundated with water mixed with sewerage. Breaches occurred in almost all the canals. Crops of chillies, wheat, rice, tomato and banana

trees standing on about 45,000 acres of area were damaged.

Islamic Relief provided emergency relief assistance to 2,100 people affected by the rains and floods, in villages of district Badin, to protect them from starvation and disease. Islamic Relief provided food packets, hygiene kits, jerry cans and utensil sets to 261 affected families. This package had been designed according to SPHERE minimum standards for Emergency. In addition to that, Islamic Relief was the focal point for coordination amongst international (I) NGOs, as the chair of "INGO Forum for Disaster Preparedness and Response".
